
Annual Barbeque

Hallsville Schools Celebrate Anniversary

On May 21, 2021, Hallsville Schools celebrated their 100th graduating class. Although the rain changed plans to celebrate the graduation on the football stadium, a crowd of over 700 people heard High School Principal Scott Daly talk about the history of the school.

The class size has certainly changed since the class of 1921 with seven graduates to the Class of 2021 with 101 graduates.

Hallsville High School was established in 1919 when the first building was erected on the land donated by Wesley and Bertie Wright and David B. Carpenter. After the building was occupied in 1920, the three year curriculum was expanded to four years of credit being required to graduate.

Previous to the building of the high school, there were several private high schools held in homes in Hallsville. The other option was to travel by train into Columbia to attend Columbia High School (now Hickman High School). The original high school was torn down about 2014 to make way for a new wing for the high school.

Hallsville Schools

The schools of the Hallsville community started out as one-room schoolhouses scattered around the area on small plots of land. Many of the roads that these school were on are named with the school name. The schools were French School, Varnon School, Barnes School, Baker School, Locust Grove School, Owens School, and Roberts School. None of these schools were within Hallsville. One of the earliest schools started about 1870 and continued until consolidation started in 1939. These schools served students from grades 1 to 8 with a single teacher. They were equipped with a globe, map, charts, a slate blackboard, and desks for students. Extra supplies like playground equipment or art supplies was often purchased with funds from pie suppers, rummage sales, and bingo games held by parents.

The first school in Hallsville was built in 1892 and it was a two-room schoolhouse. It was located where the Hallsville Community Center is now. The big bell that was used in that schoolhouse is now on display in the Mercantile Museum as well as a smaller bell that used by a teacher to call students in from recess. In 1949, the school district was reorganized and named Hallsville R-IV (Reorganized District 4) with all of the one-room schoolhouses closing. A school for grades 1-8 was built next to the high school and students moved in 1951. That building presently holds the middle school.


